

## **Mark Chapter 10 Study Guide**

“For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.” Mark 10:45

### ***Instructions:***

***Take a moment to rid yourself of distractions. Slow your breathing down, and clear your mind. When ready, pray to God and ask him to give you insight into his word. Pray and ask the Holy Spirit for understanding while you read.***

#### **Read Mark 10:1-12**

1. Where does Jesus leave from, and where does he go?
2. Why did the Pharisees approach Jesus?
3. What do they ask him?
4. How does he respond?
5. Were the disciples confused about his response? Why or why not?

#### **Read Mark 10: 13-16**

1. What happens in these verses?
2. What emotion does Jesus feel? Describe what you think he was feeling?
3. Why did the disciples rebuke the crowds?
4. What does this story teach us about our powerful rabbi?

#### **Read Mark 10: 17-31**

1. What question did the man ask Jesus?
2. What is Jesus's response?
3. How does the young man respond?
4. What did the disciples think about his reaction?
5. Paraphrase Jesus response to his disciples in your own words?
6. What does this tell us about the cost of following Jesus?

#### **Read Mark 10: 32- 34**

1. Where was Jesus going?
2. Where is Jesus in relation to the crowds and his disciples?
3. What does he tell his disciples? (go back and read Mark 8:31 & Mark 9:30-32) How do these details differ from the previous passages?

#### **Read Mark 10:35-45**

1. Who goes to Jesus and asks a question?
2. What does Jesus say to them?
3. What do they ask?
4. How do the other disciples respond to this?

5. Recall earlier in this chapter, that Jesus himself was also indignant. Do you think this was how the disciples were feeling? Why or why not?
6. What does Jesus teach them about authority among his disciples?
7. What does Jesus say about himself?

**Read Mark 10: 46-52**

1. Where are they now?
2. Who is sitting by the roadside? What does he do?
3. Jesus calls him, and asks him a question. What does Jesus ask?
4. Have we seen this question earlier in this chapter?
5. How does the blind man's response differ from James and John's request earlier?
